# University of Miyazaki (Miyazaki Prefecture)

Students will study their specialized fields under the guidance of their advisor. They may also visit local schools to experience directly how the Japanese education system works.

## ◇ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students

### ① Characteristics of the program

- Students will study their specialized fields and audit the classes of their specialized fields and of Japanese language under the guidance of their advisor.
- Students can participate in field trips and Japanese local internship. They will have opportunities to study with Japanese students.

### ② Number of students to be accepted: no more than 3

### ③ Period of scholarship

From October 2026 to March 2028

### ④ Requirement for program completion

A Student has to write and submit a report which meets the following conditions:

- Theme should be in accordance with the study theme the student wrote in his/her application.
- Language should be Japanese or English.
- The length should be 4 pages of A4 size sheet, or more.
- Submission should be both by print and digital media.
- Print media: Submit a copy to Academic Affair & Student Support Office, Graduate School of Education.
- Digital media: Submit data by e-mail to a subsection chief of Academic Affair & Student Support Office, Graduate School of Education. ([e-kyoumu@of.miyazaki-u.ac.jp](mailto:e-kyoumu@of.miyazaki-u.ac.jp))
- Deadline: 17:00 on the last day of February 2028. (If the last day is holiday, 17:00 on the next weekday.)

### ⑤ Outline of the course

After studying Japanese language for six months at another institution in Japan, students will study at the in-service teacher training program at the University of Miyazaki for one year.

- Students will study their specialized fields under the guidance of their advisor.

• Students have to submit a report on their research by 17:00 on the last day of February 2028. (If the last day is holiday, submit it by 17:00 on the next weekday.)

- Students can audit the classes of their specialized fields and Japanese language classes under the guidance of their advisor. (They cannot get credits for the classes they audit.)

- Students can have opportunities to visit elementary and secondary schools and take part in cultural exchange activities with pupils at these schools.



## ◇ Follow-up for graduates

- Advisors keep in touch with their former students through SNS.
- A follow-up to courses may be offered at the discretion of advisors.
