The University of Miyazaki (UoM), one of the National University Corporation in Japan, is a comprehensive university with the Faculties of Education, Medicine, Engineering, Agriculture and Regional Innovation, and 7 graduate schools. As the center of knowledge in Miyazaki, UoM provides advanced education, research, and regional/international contributions. UoM contributes to where it stands to act as a community of destiny and disseminates our achievements to the world. One distinctive feature is to promote unique research and education that fuses different academic disciplines and builds links that meet the needs of the region. With our motto, "Look at the World, Start with the Community", we put great importance on the student perspective and encourage them to enjoy learning and research activities, along with the university lives.

**UoM has entered academic exchange agreements with more than 100 engages in international research and educational activities. Currently, 133 international students from 24 countries/regions are enrolled at UoM.** (as of May 1, 2024)

### SAKURA Science Exchange Program of the Japan Science and Technology (JST)

The SAKURA Science Exchange Program has been carried more than 70 times since 2014. Under this program, we have invited students, young researchers and faculty members from all over the world. Program participants attend lectures and take part in hands-on experiments at UoM laboratories to acquire skills and techniques. The program offers participants a chance to learn more about Japanese science and technology and also experience the local culture.



### Student Exchange Program

UoM runs a one- to two-week course program and a short-term exchange program based on the Student Exchange Memorandum.



### Inter-University Exchange Project (2023-2027)

UoM is implementing the Inter-University Exchange Project "Circulation of Knowledge Connecting the Region and the World: Japan-U.S.-Taiwan-S. Korea Global Human Resource Development Program aiming to tackle GX Challenges" under the funding support of the Ministry of Education.

There are four different ways for international students to study in Japan, depending on the type of funding they receive and the length of their study.

- Japanese government-funded
- Overseas government-funded
- Exchange students
- Privately funded

### Tuition Exemption

An international student enrolled as a regular student at UoM who has an excellent academic record but finds it difficult to pay tuition due to unavoidable circumstances may apply for an exemption. If selected, he or she may be provided a tuition discount of 100,000 yen or 200,000 yen or a full tuition exemption for the semester in question. (this system does not apply to non-regular student such as research students or auditors etc.)

### Tutor System

Some Japanese students at UoM are selected to act as tutors and offer their support to new international students by helping them with Japanese language study and adjustment to daily life.

### Cooperation with Various International Exchange Organizations

UoM provides support and guidance to the Miyazaki University Foreign Students Association (MUFSa) in an advisory capacity. In addition, we collaborate with other international exchange organizations off campus to promote the welfare of international students in Miyazaki and contribute to international understanding in the region as a whole. We offer activities such as visits to schools, Japanese families, and more.

### International Dormitories

UoM has a system in place to provide accommodations for international students, researchers and their families. Each dormitory unit is equipped with furniture and appliances so that students and researchers can focus on their studies right away.



### Islamic Center

Islamic Center was established to meet the needs of Muslim students, who make up around a third of all international students at UoM.

# Getting to Miyazaki

People traveling to Miyazaki from overseas often travel via Tokyo, Osaka, Nagoya, or Fukuoka, but there are direct flights to Miyazaki from South Korea and Taiwan. Miyazaki Airport is about 15 minutes by car from either campus.
